

BRAIN CARE

BRAIN CONDITIONS HAVEN'T CHANGED. WHAT WE CAN DO FOR THEM HAS.

Donors to the Brain Centre Campaign have already committed nearly \$40 million. And they're just getting started.

The University Hospital Foundation's Brain Centre Campaign is committed to ensuring that patients with potentially devastating brain conditions have access to the best people, using the best technology, in the best healing environments.

"Our vision is to provide brain patients from across Alberta, western and northern Canada access to the very best treatment in the world - in an environment that optimizes patient care, allows families to be part of treatment, and allows specialized staff to focus on their patients," says Jim Brown, who along with Guy Scott, is Co-Chair of the Brain Centre Campaign.

Delivering faster stroke care

Canada's first Stroke Ambulance - complete with a CT scanner, clot-busting drugs and the potential to treat a stroke before the patient even reaches hospital - is coming to Alberta. The total cost of the Stroke Ambulance - \$3.3 million - will be funded by donors to the University Hospital Foundation.

Northern Alberta's centre for stroke care

The Stroke Ambulance will add one more piece of advanced technology to the University of Alberta Hospital - western Canada's leading stroke centre - by joining forces with one of the most far-reaching and effective Telestroke programs in Canada, and the diagnostic expertise at the A.H. Owen and Family Stroke Prevention Clinic.

The University of Alberta Hospital is also the only site in central and northern Alberta with the capacity to perform minimally invasive clot retrieval procedures known as endovascular thrombectomies. Since 2014, demand for removing blood clots from the brain using this image-guided therapy has doubled.

The Brain Centre Campaign is committed to making this procedure available to more stroke patients by outfitting a second suite - at a cost of \$1.7 million - with the advanced equipment needed to give more stroke patients the chance to survive and recover as fully as possible.

LEADING BY EXAMPLE

For the past 40 years, friends (from left) Guy & Shelley Scott and Sharon & Jim Brown have shared a commitment to family and community.

It's that commitment that led to a \$3 million gift to the University Hospital Foundation's Brain Centre Campaign to support Alberta's first Gamma Knife and 3T MR Imaging Centre at the University of Alberta Hospital.

"It's about leading by example," said Guy Scott. "This gift will help make the most advanced technology available to Albertans with brain tumours or growths that are threatening their lives."

As campaign Co-Chairs, Guy Scott and Jim Brown have been architects of the Brain Centre Campaign from the very beginning.



ADVANCING CARE

DENNIS ERKER'S \$1 MILLION DONATION IS ADVANCING CARE
FOR PEOPLE WHO – LIKE HIM – ARE LIVING WITH PARKINSON'S

"I was shocked," said Edmonton businessman and community leader Dennis Erker, when he was diagnosed with Parkinson's in 2015. "It was very upsetting."

"My wife Doreen suspected I may have Parkinson's. She noticed I wasn't using my right hand as much as I used to, and I was walking with a slight stoop."

Dr. Janis Miyasaki, Medical Director of the Movement Disorders Program at the University of Alberta Hospital, confirmed their concerns.

"Dr. Miyasaki told me I may have two years, four years, 20 years. You never know. Then we began talking about hope and the role of powerful positive thinking. I decided I wanted to make a gift, and I wanted to do it now."

Dennis Erker's gift will support innovative advancements in patient care and research such as hope-focused intervention, technology-assisted decision making, and

the Complex and Supportive Care Clinic at the University of Alberta Hospital, the only clinic in western Canada to incorporate a team-based approach to Parkinson's patient care.

NOW I CAN DO EVERYTHING

When he was 5 years old, Peter Ward developed a stutter. A few years later, he found that he could only walk by dragging his feet. Then he became pigeon-toed. One by one his muscles were failing him. "I was slowly going paralyzed but nobody knew it."

By the time he was 18, Peter's fingers and toes were curling inwards and his thumbs twitched

uncontrollably. Walking down a hallway at school left him exhausted. He quit swimming because it wasn't fun. "I'd jump in the water and sink like a stone."

It wasn't until Peter met Dr. Janis Miyasaki, Medical Director of the Movement Disorders Program at the University of Alberta Hospital, that his condition was properly

diagnosed as a form of dystonia that responds to medication. The care plan she prescribed changed Peter's life.

"I can do everything because of her," says Peter, now a full-time student at MacEwan University. "I have so much energy now I don't know what to do with it. It's like living in a new body."

LOVE BIRDS

A TRANSFORMATIONAL GIFT
BY JAMES AND JEANIE BROWN
WILL PUT EDMONTON AT THE
FOREFRONT OF ALS PATIENT
CARE AND RESEARCH



"I was devastated," says Jeanie Brown of the day she was diagnosed with ALS, a progressive neurodegenerative condition also known as Lou Gehrig's disease. "My life took a flip-flop."

Born and raised in Edmonton, Jeanie spent several years in northern British Columbia before returning to Edmonton, where she met her husband, James. "I met this guy for tea and thought, yeah, he's interesting. That was almost 25 years ago."

A prominent Edmonton lawyer and philanthropist, James Brown says that coming to grips with the fact there is no known cure for ALS has been one of the toughest challenges to deal with. "You feel helpless," says James. "But we knew there was no way we could just sit and do nothing." So they took on ALS the way they've done everything else for the past 25 years – together.

After meeting with Dr. Wendy Johnston, a neurologist and Medical Director of the ALS Clinic at the Kaye Edmonton Clinic, Jeanie decided to participate in research studies offered by Dr. Johnston and her colleague, Dr. Sanjay Kalra.

James and Jeanie also decided to give a transformational \$1 million gift in support of ALS patient care and research. "The gift is meant to encourage doctors at the ALS Clinic to be 'research ready' and to shoot for the stars," says James. "Who knows what can happen? We could change the world for people with ALS."

TESTING FOR ALS

The only way to diagnose ALS is by ruling out other diseases that have similar symptoms, says Dr. Sanjay Kalra, a neurologist and researcher at the University of Alberta Hospital. On average, that process can take up to a year.

Developing a faster way to identify the presence of ALS would mean

patients could begin treatment and enroll in clinical trials sooner.

Dr. Kalra is using advanced MR Imaging to study the impact of ALS on the brain. The methods being developed will play an integral role in the discovery of new treatments for people with this debilitating condition.



DONOR DRIVEN

DONOR SUPPORT IS KEEPING THE MAZ ON THE LEADING EDGE OF CARDIAC CARE

After contributing 25 cents of every dollar to build the Maz, donors are now ensuring that western Canada's leading heart institute remains at the forefront of cardiac care.

"There's no question - community support is keeping us on the leading edge," says Mishaela Houle, Executive Director of the Mazankowski Alberta Heart Institute. "Take the trend towards minimally invasive surgery as an example. That's the future of cardiac surgery. Patients are on their feet sooner after surgery. They're in less pain. Their average stay in hospital is reduced, in some cases by several days."

National Leader

By fully funding the \$6.6 million Cardiac Hybrid Operating Room, purchasing specialized surgical tools, and helping to recruit some of the best doctors in the world, donor support has enabled the Maz to be a national leader in the field of minimally invasive surgery.

And that's not all, explains Houle. "When we recruit new doctors to support our minimally invasive surgery program, they bring their expertise to the Maz, and share their knowledge with the rest of the team. That process makes everyone better, which benefits a greater number of patients."

Critical Innovation

Dr. Robert Welsh, Zone Medical Director for Cardiac Sciences in Edmonton, adds that community support is the fuel that drives innovation at the Maz. "I cannot emphasize enough that donor support is absolutely critical to everything that's done at the Maz."

"Without donor support, we cannot innovate beyond where we currently stand, and we have to basically follow other programs. Donor support allows us to stay at the front end of innovation and lead the country."

SAVING MAVERICK

Born with congenital heart disease, Maverick Vanderzwaag was barely one week old when he was flown from his home in Winnipeg to Edmonton for open heart surgery at the Mazankowski Alberta Heart Institute.

Thirty-three days on life support and multiple follow-up surgeries later, Maverick is now three years old and back at home, enjoying life with his brothers and sisters. His most recent tests show that his heart has stabilized. "That's the best news we've ever received," says his mother, Rachel.

"I cannot say enough about the doctors and staff at the Mazankowski Alberta Heart Institute. We are so grateful that they kept our family together."



SUPPORTING LIFE

EXPANDING THE LIFE SUPPORT PROGRAM AT THE MAZ HAS DRAMATICALLY IMPROVED CARE FOR PATIENTS FACING LIFE-THREATENING ILLNESS – ALL THANKS TO DONOR GENEROSITY

The most critically ill patients at the Mazankowski Alberta Heart Institute need life support to survive.

“The ECMO (extracorporeal membrane oxygenation) program, also known as life support, is a pillar program at the Maz,” says Mishaela Houle, Executive Director of the Mazankowski Alberta Heart Institute. “And one in which we’re seeing significant growth.”

The ECMO program at the Maz provides life-saving care to patients with severe respiratory or cardiac failure. It cares for the most complex cases across northern Alberta.

Since 2009, ECMO has also been used to treat patients with breathing complications due to the H1N1 virus that caused a worldwide pandemic that year. “Mortality rates have dropped dramatically for patients with H1N1 since we started putting them on life support,” explains Dr. Gurmeet Singh, Medical Director of the

Adult ECMO program at the Maz. “They now have a 75% – 85% survival rate.”

ECMO therapy at the Maz is also being used as a bridge for support for patients awaiting heart or lung transplants.

In 2015, generous sponsors and call-in donors to the University Hospital Foundation’s annual 630 CHED Heart Pledge Day gave a record-breaking \$250,000 to support the purchase of an advanced ECMO Transport System: portable life-support technology that doctors from the Maz can take with them to save the lives of out-of-town patients who may not survive the trip back to the Maz without it.

“The life support program at the Maz would not be what it is today without donor support,” says Houle. “There are desperately sick patients every year whose lives depend on it.”



INVINCIBLE? NOT QUITE

“Mom always said to me, ‘You’re loadin’ the chevy too heavy,’” says Carl Rosenau, a long time donor to the University Hospital Foundation. “I always said, ‘Mom, I’m invincible. It won’t happen to me.’ Well, I was wrong.”

Decades of working 16-hour days for Rosenau Transport, founded by his father August Rosenau, caught up to Carl on February 11, 2010. “I was actually recovering from hip replacement surgery at

the Edmonton General Hospital. The nurse came into my room and I said, ‘Is it hot in here?’ I was sweaty, dizzy. The next day, same thing happened.”

Rushed to the Mazankowski Alberta Heart Institute, Carl underwent quadruple bypass surgery and had his aortic valve replaced. His surgery coincided with the University Hospital Foundation’s annual 630 CHED Heart Pledge Day.

Carl’s wife, Grace, shared his story on the radio, and donations from his friends and colleagues started rolling in.

“I’ve always been a believer in supporting your community,” says Carl, a generous donor since 1995. “When you have something as good as the Mazankowski, you have to support it. The people they have there, the technology – it’s a selling feature for Edmonton.”

MORE SALT?

DONOR SUPPORT ADVANCES
CARE AND RESEARCH AT THE
MAZANKOWSKI ALBERTA
HEART INSTITUTE'S HEART
FUNCTION CLINIC



Dr. Justin Ezekowitz, cardiologist and Director of the Heart Function Clinic at the Mazankowski Alberta Heart Institute, has a question about salt – is it good or bad for cardiac patients with end-stage heart disease?

“It’s important for us to know, for our patients’ benefit, whether a higher salt diet or a lower salt diet is better,” says Dr. Ezekowitz. “While you and I may want to have lower salt in our diet, it’s different for patients with life-threatening heart disease. Bodies respond differently to salt when a disease is present. Maybe lower or higher salt is better.”

Dr. Ezekowitz received a \$35,000 seed grant through the University Hospital Foundation’s Medical Research Competition to support an initial pilot project with about 30 patients. Results from that study were leveraged into a grant through Alberta Innovative Health Solutions and greater involvement of the Canadian VIGOUR Centre, which in turn led to a \$700,000 grant from the Canadian Institute of Health Research.

With an additional \$200,000 from the University Hospital Foundation, the project has expanded into Chile, Mexico, Australia and New Zealand. “We’re working towards our 300th patient out of 1,000 patients,” says Dr. Ezekowitz. “We are now leading the largest international clinical trial that’s ever been done in the area of sodium intake.”

HELPING HEARTS

“We can improve and maintain the quality of life for our patients quite significantly,” says Dr. Justin Ezekowitz, Director of the Heart Function Clinic.

Established in 1989, the Heart Function Clinic is the oldest such clinic in Canada. A staff of seven doctors, four nurses, three pharmacists, one dietician and one nurse practitioner care for over 1,000 seriously ill cardiac patients from Alberta, northern

British Columbia, the Territories and Saskatchewan.

Donors to the University Hospital Foundation have supported care at the Heart Function Clinic for decades. “We’re grateful for every donation we’ve received,” says Dr. Ezekowitz. “Community support has gone towards educational opportunities for our nurses, and research initiatives that we use to advance the quality of care for every new patient.”

SAVING LIVES

AT NORTHERN ALBERTA'S LEVEL ONE TRAUMA CENTRE

When their lives are in danger, critically injured patients are brought to the University of Alberta Hospital.

As the Level One Trauma Centre serving central and northern Alberta, the University of Alberta Hospital serves a massive geographic area that covers all of Alberta north of Red Deer, northeastern British Columbia, Saskatchewan and the Territories.

It's also the only hospital in Edmonton that has the advanced equipment, state-of-the-art technology and level of specialties required to provide the most advanced care to patients with life threatening injuries to multiple parts of their bodies.

Capacity to care for 'worst possible situations'

Much of that care involves a multidisciplinary approach that includes trauma trained surgeons, orthopaedic surgeons, spine surgeons, neurosurgeons, critical care specialists, and plastic surgeons who specialize in burn care at the Firefighters' Burn Treatment Unit, western Canada's largest and most advanced burn treatment unit.

"60% of the trauma cases we see at the University of Alberta Hospital require complex surgery to

survive," says Dr. Ron Brisebois, Chief of Surgery at the University of Alberta Hospital. "It would not be possible to provide that level of surgical care without the support we've received from donors to the University Hospital Foundation."

Support through Full House Lottery, Festival of Trees

Community support through the 2015 Festival of Trees, 2016 Full House Lottery and generous community donors raised over \$1.4 million and provided complex surgery teams at the University of Alberta Hospital the advanced equipment they need to care for more severely ill or injured trauma patients than anywhere else in Canada.

"When you're dealing with a patient who's as close to dying as the patients we regularly see here, you rely on your equipment and technology more than ever. That's why having the best is so important," says Dr. Brisebois. "We have our donors to thank for that. Without them we would not be able to save the lives of the people we're caring for."

SUMMER PROJECT

Severe trauma patients rarely need more than three units of blood to save their lives. Following her car accident, Katelyn Phillips-Derkacz needed 48. Her list of injuries – broken back, severed liver, shattered kidney, collapsed lung, to name a few – was so alarming that her mother Celeste could barely tolerate hearing them.

Dr. Ron Brisebois, Chief of Surgery at the University of Alberta Hospital, and a team of world class surgeons and specialists were responsible for putting Katelyn back together again.

"She was bleeding to death when she arrived here," says Dr. Brisebois. "There were lots of complications

to deal with. I spent a lot of time with her - she was my summer project."

Fully recovered, Katelyn is now working and interested in pursuing a career in health care. "I am certain that Dr. Brisebois and his team saved my life."

OF THOUSANDS OF ALBERTANS

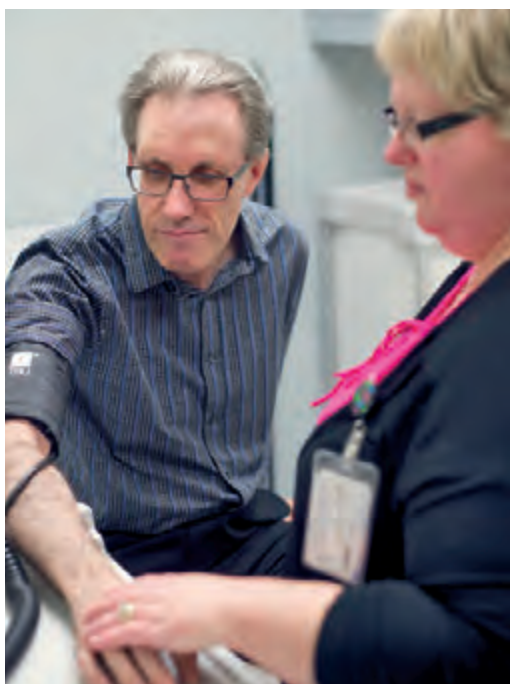


With nearly 80 outpatient clinics under one roof, patients with complex health issues have access to the convenience and expertise they deserve.

With almost 265,000 patient visits in 2015-16, the Kaye Edmonton Clinic is delivering on its promise to revolutionize outpatient care in northern Alberta.

"Patients are very appreciative that they can get their testing done and meet with two or three specialists and multidisciplinary care providers within one day," says Elizabeth Seib, Executive Director, Ambulatory Care for the Edmonton Zone.

Opened in July 2012, the Kaye Edmonton Clinic is named in honour of a \$30 million gift from Edmonton businessman and philanthropist Donald Kaye.

MIRACLE WORKERS

THE BEST PATIENT OUTCOMES IN NORTH AMERICA

Head and neck cancers are common, devastating – and on the rise.

The Head and Neck Oncology program at the University of Alberta Hospital provides world leading care to over 250 new patients every year – from across western and northern Canada – with head and neck cancer. Of those, about 170 will need dramatic facial reconstruction surgery.

Why? Because head and neck cancers threaten our most basic functions – eating, speaking, even the way we look in our day-to-day lives. Once the cancer is removed, these characteristics that define who we are and how we live have to be recovered.

The University of Alberta Hospital program has developed an aggressive, highly specialized treatment protocol that focuses on incredibly complex microvascular reconstruction and preservation of salivary glands with post-operative chemotherapy and radiation therapy.

And the results of this sophisticated protocol are being recognized and used as part of treatment around the world.

Thanks to donor support, dedicated doctors and staff at the University of Alberta Hospital's Head and Neck Oncology Program have access to the advanced technology they need to plan and perform these complex surgeries, and funding for ground-breaking research that advances care.

Last year, \$47,000 raised through Manuary, a community-based fundraiser that invites men to grow beards in support of Head and Neck Cancer, supported Dr. Vince Biron's research into finding faster and less intrusive ways of diagnosing head and neck cancers.

Donors also equipped Head and Neck Cancer surgeons with 16 advanced laryngoscopes, enabling the highly specialized team to provide more daily diagnostic testing, helping more patients than ever before.

AS GOOD AS NEW

Healthy and active, Dan Antoniuk, a recently retired schoolteacher, did not think anything of the lump on his neck until his daughter Laura, a nurse, told him to get it checked out.

That was in December, 2013. Within a month, Dan was sitting in the office of Dr. Hadi Seikaly, Director of the Division of Otolaryngology for the Head and Neck Cancer Program at the University of Alberta Hospital.

"I was devastated when I found out I had cancer," Dan recounts. "But the moment Dr. Seikaly walked through the door I knew I was in good hands. He told me, 'You're in the best place you could possibly be. We'll take care of this.'"

Today, Dan is enjoying life and grateful for the outstanding work of Dr. Seikaly and his team.

Donor support funds breakthrough discovery in preventing heart damage in breast cancer patients.

“Our research will lower the rates of heart weakening and in some cases obliterate the heart failure that we see in cancer patients,” says Dr. Ian Paterson, lead researcher on the study and cardiologist at the Mazankowski Alberta Heart Institute.

Funded by the University Hospital Foundation’s Medical Research Competition, Dr. Paterson and his team have determined that two different types of heart medications - beta blockers and ACE inhibitors - prevent heart weakening in breast cancer patients who have undergone chemotherapy or radiation as part of their cancer treatment.

Cancer therapies such as Herceptin are known to improve survival rates for early-stage cancer patients. However, they can also increase the risk of heart failure by as much as five times.

“We discovered that patients who took one heart pill (Perindopril or Bisoprolol) every day during their

cancer therapy experienced little lowering of heart function,” says Dr. Paterson.

Results from the study may also lead to more effective cancer treatments, adds Dr. Paterson. Whenever a patient shows signs of heart weakening, the cancer treatments are stopped until the heart recovers.

By preventing heart issues, the patient will be able to get the therapy they’re meant to receive, when they need it.

The study involved 94 breast cancer patients in Edmonton and Winnipeg. “Funding from the University Hospital Foundation enabled the collaboration between the two sites,” explains Dr. Paterson.

The University Hospital Foundation’s Medical Research Competition has provided \$5 million in seed funding to more than 250 peer-reviewed research projects over the past 10 years.

RESEARCH PARTNERS

In 2015, the University Hospital Foundation announced the formation of the \$2 million Johnson & Johnson Alberta Health Innovation Partnership fund, JAHIP, a three-way partnership between the University Hospital Foundation, Janssen (the pharmaceutical division of Johnson & Johnson), and the Government of

Alberta’s department of Economic Development & Trade.

This partnership built a \$2 million fund to invest in innovation in prostate health patient care, and evidence-supported improvement in health services delivery in mental health, diabetes, oncology and immunology.

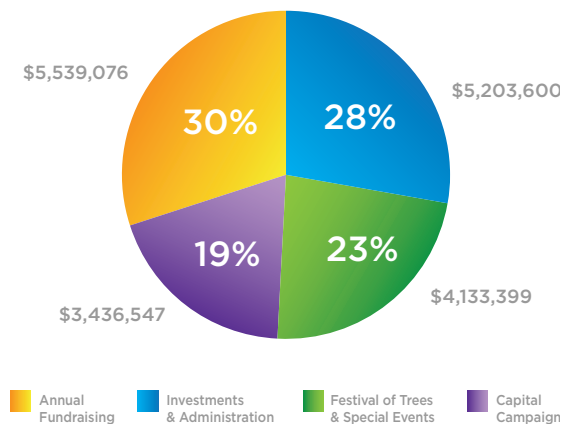
Raising \$18.3 million (net), and increasing our total net revenue* to \$162.1 million over the past ten years;

Committing to advance patient care and research over the next three years through funding commitments of \$32 million;

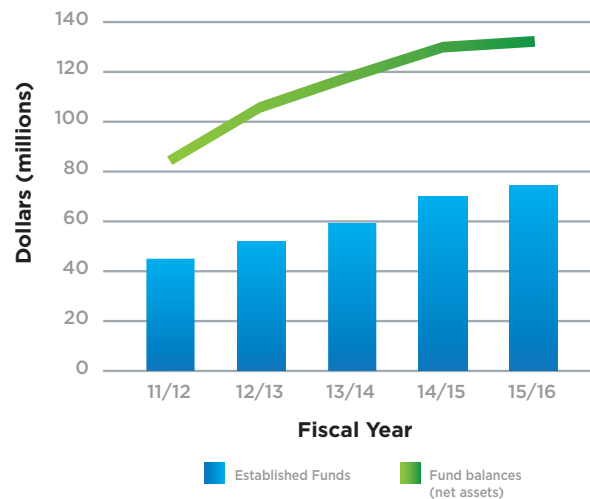
Distributing \$6.0 million to support innovation and health related care at the University of Alberta Hospital site; and

Growing our fund balances (net assets) by \$6.1 million.

Strong fundraising year

Donors' commitment to supporting the University of Alberta hospital site was exceptional in the 2015-2016 fiscal year, even though Alberta's economy faced challenges.

Our strategic focus on diversifying our revenue sources was successful as current donor support and gifts through bequests and planned gifts, in combination with a successful Full House Lottery, Festival of Trees and community events, resulted in another year of growth. This year we've also grown our operational capacity; laying a solid foundation for future growth.

Established Funds

At \$74.6 million, the Foundation's 204 Established Funds represent a significant portion of the Foundation's \$131.8 million fund balances (net assets).

Each year investment income is allocated to the Established Funds. This allocation is calculated based on a five-year net annualized investment return. For the 2015-2016 year, the allocation rate remained strong at 8.5%.

Based on each Established Fund's Terms of Reference, distributions are made to support diverse areas of care

at the University of Alberta Hospital, the Mazankowski Alberta Heart Institute and the Kaye Edmonton Clinic. In 2015-2016 distributions included \$2.2 million from Established Funds.

Distributions

The Foundation distributed fewer funds than in previous years, \$6.0 million, as a result of the timing of requests for distributions from AHS. However, over the next three years, the Foundation has committed to distribute \$32 million, as major projects funded by the Foundation are completed. For example, both the C.J. Woods Prostate Health Clinic, and the MRI component of the Gamma Knife and 3T MR Imaging Centre, will open this fall.

Strong realized investment returns

Realized investment returns remained strong at \$7.2 million during the 2015-2016 fiscal year. The Foundation's overall investment portfolio rate of return was 7.23%, again exceeding the relative investment portfolio benchmarks, this year by 2.93%.


Passing the test

Turbulent capital markets in Alberta impacted the market value of investments, causing a \$6.1 million unrealized (non-cash) loss on March 31, 2016. However, as unrealized losses are absorbed by the University Hospital Foundation's General Fund, and not applied against Established Funds, donor investments remain secure and are not impacted.

In order to maintain the long term sustainability of the Foundation, even in challenging economic times, a Stress Test is calculated annually to ensure the General Fund has the capacity to absorb the subsequent year's operating costs and a potential downturn in the market. Once again, the Stress Test determined that the Foundation's General Fund is sufficient to weather future economic storms.

Our commitment to transparency

The University Hospital Foundation complies with all regulatory requirements, and uses Service Canada guidelines to calculate cost of fundraising. The 2015-2016 cost to raise a dollar was \$0.21. To review the Foundation's complete audited financial statements, please visit GivetoUHF.ca.
