On December 4, 2017, the first patient received life-changing Gamma Knife treatment at the University of Alberta Hospital's \$17.2 million Scott and Brown Families Advanced Imaging & Gamma Knife Centre. Between then and June 30, 2018, 155 patients have received 202 treatments. I went home to a new life

Not everyone gets invited to Buckingham Palace to receive the Member of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire from Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II – but Mona Nashman Smith of Edmonton did. Honoured for her work in international education, Mona spent almost 25 years in Germany and Oman developing education for students from around the world.

Headaches forced her quit. Painful, pulsating headaches that would leave her bedridden for days. An MRI revealed the cause to be a noncancerous growth in her left ear canal. Mona sought help from specialists around the world - what they told her was far from encouraging. The location of the growth made surgery challenging and extremely risky: irreversible paralysis on the left side of her face and deafness in her left ear were almost certain.

As she pondered what seemed like a no-win situation, Mona received a phone call – that changed her life. With a Masters degree in international education and a doctorate in educational leadership, Mona was more than qualified for the challenge of being CEO and superintendent of an IB World School and responsible for the education of 1200 students representing 73 nationalities. "I loved my work in Oman. I'm very proud of what I was able to do there."

Her career would have lasted much longer had it not been for the onset of debilitating pain. "The headaches were horrible," said Mona. "From 2007 to 2014, when I returned home to Edmonton, I was having up to 2-3 headaches every week. I was functioning, I could do my job, but barely. I really felt at one point, before I came back, that I would probably go to sleep and not wake up."

Enter Dr. Keith Aronyk, Clinical Department Head, Neurosciences, University of Alberta Hospital, and his talented Gamma Knife team. "At that point, I had never heard of Gamma Knife (see story, page 6)," said Mona. "Not one of the doctors I had seen before about my headaches had mentioned it as an option. After meeting with Dr. Aronyk I told him, 'I'm ready to go. Let's get rid of these horrible headaches.'"

Donors to the University Hospital Foundation's Brain Centre Campaign funded the \$17.2 million Gamma Knife and 3T MR imaging, which is housed in the Scott and Brown Families Advanced Imaging & Gamma Knife Centre.

The first Gamma Knife patient received treatment on December 4, 2017. Since then, 155 patients have received 202 Gamma Knife treatments. One of them was Mona.

"I went to the hospital at 6:30 in the morning and was home by 1:30 that afternoon. I don't have headaches anymore. I can go to the gym. I can play with my grandchildren. I tell everyone I talk to, it's a living miracle. I have a hard time believing it myself sometimes."

All-star line-up

Wayne Gretzky brings powerful presence and compassion to the Brain Centre Campaign

Wayne Gretzky knows what it's like to fear for the loss of a loved one due to a brain condition. "We thought we had lost Dad to a brain aneurysm years ago. Today he also has Parkinson's. As a family member, it's difficult to deal with."

Combined with his storied connection to Edmonton, Wayne's desire to advance brain care for all patients with debilitating brain conditions made him a perfect fit for the University Hospital Foundation's Brain Centre Campaign.

To the excitement of everyone associated with the campaign, he agreed, becoming Honorary Chair of the Brain Centre Campaign Cabinet. "I've always liked being a part of a winning team," said Wayne, who underlined his commitment with a generous leadership donation to the campaign. "With support from a community like Edmonton, I know the Brain Centre Campaign will do great things, and accomplish everything we set out to do."

Best and brightest leaders, doctors

Wayne joins a Campaign Cabinet team already lined with some of Edmonton's most respected leaders and philanthropists, such as Jim Brown and Guy Scott, Co-chairs of the Brain Centre Campaign Cabinet, and some of the best and brightest brain doctors, like Dr. Jeremy Rempel, Interventional and Diagnostic Neuroradiologist, at the University of Alberta Hospital's Brain Centre.

Combined with Canada's first Stroke Ambulance and the work of Dr. Rempel and his colleagues, the University of Alberta Hospital has become the centre for stroke care in northern Alberta.

Home in time for dinner

Perhaps no other piece of technology has arrived at the University of Alberta Hospital with greater expectations than the Gamma Knife.

The most advanced form of noninvasive brain surgery in the world, Gamma Knife gives brain surgeons the technology to treat hard-to-reach, benign brain tumours and malformations, cancers that have spread to the brain, and certain other brain conditions – without the risk and prolonged recovery of open brain surgery. That means instead of a two-to-three month recovery, Gamma Knife patients (see Mona Nashman Smith's story, page 5) are able to return home the same day as their treatment and are back to living their lives the very next day.


"The fact that a patient can arrive here in the morning, have their Gamma Knife treatment and be home in time for dinner the same day is amazing," said Dr. Keith Aronyk, Clinical Department Head for Neurosciences at the University of Alberta Hospital.

A new, state-of-the-art neuro intensive care unit will give severely ill and injured brain patients the best chance possible to survive and recover, said Dr. David Zygun, Edmonton Zone Medical Director with Alberta Health Services.

"Thanks to \$50 million in community support, the University of Alberta Hospital is home to one of Canada's leading brain centres," said Jim Brown, Chair of the University Hospital Foundation, and Co-Chair, along with Guy Scott, of the University Hospital Foundation's Brain Centre Campaign. "A new neuro intensive care unit will enable our doctors to fully utilize the other advancements in brain care we've provided, including Canada's first Stroke Ambulance, intra-operative 3T imaging, and the incredible Gamma Knife and 3T MRI."

The current 11-bed neuro ICU, designed in the mideighties, runs at or above capacity on a daily basis.

A new neuro ICU will provide privacy to patients and their family, and an optimum environment for the healthcare team to deliver the highest level of patient focused care that's practiced throughout the University of Alberta Hospital.

Contingent on a government funding commitment to build the new ICU, the University Hospital Foundation's Brain Centre Campaign will continue to focus on raising additional funds to equip a new neuro ICU with the most advanced monitoring equipment and technology to provide the best care to the critically ill patients in the unit.


"To achieve the best possible outcomes, we need the best people with the best technology in the best working environment," said Dr. Shelley Duggan, Interim Medical Director of the Neurointensive Care Unit.

"With more community and government investment, we will complete this final, and critically needed, phase of the Brain Centre Campaign," added Guy Scott.

I was in serious trouble

Dr. Tim Graham knows an emergency when he sees one. And he's seen a lot of them. Tim spent 13 years at the University of Alberta Hospital, working in one of Canada's busiest emergency departments as an emergency physician.

Despite the thousands of people he's cared for over the years, one life-altering experience stands above the rest.

It happened at the University of Alberta Hospital's Emergency Department. The patient arrived in near-death condition, having been resuscitated by his wife and paramedics prior to arrival. If not for the miraculous work of the emergency medical team that night, the outcome would have been tragic – especially for Tim.

He was the patient.

October 29, 2017 was a normal day for Tim and his family. He and his wife, Samina Ali, also a doctor, went to work. Their three kids, Sam, 15, Yasmeen, 12, and Shaan, 10, attended their normal activities. A healthy, active family who enjoy mountain biking and hiking together in Edmonton's scenic river valley, they had no reason to believe that

anything out of the ordinary was about to happen. Working the late shift that night, Tim didn't get home until after 1:00 a.m. and went straight to bed. Roughly four hours later, he was clinically dead.

"Samina woke up at about 5:00 that morning," said Tim, recounting the events. "I was making funny breathing sounds, and she knew immediately I was in serious trouble." Samina kept him alive long enough for the paramedics to arrive. They managed to shock his heart back to its regular rhythm – but not for long. "A team of my former colleagues from emergency resuscitated me and put me on life support."

At this point, the cause of Tim's sudden life-and-death battle to survive was unknown. Fortunately, he was in the right place at the right time. As the only Level One Trauma Centre in northern Alberta, doctors in emergency at the University of Alberta Hospital have immediate access to worldleading specialists across the spectrum of healthcare - and to advanced technology, thanks to donors to the University Hospital Foundation, who have also given generously to a \$2.5 million plan to redevelop the Emergency Department.

Working with neurologists from the Brain Centre and cardiologists from the Mazankowski Alberta Heart Institute, the emergency team caring for Tim was able to rule out stroke, blood clots in the lungs and heart attack. Later, he was diagnosed with Brugada Syndrome, a condition that causes a disruption of the heart's normal rhythm.

Today, Tim is back to work saving the lives of others, and enjoying time with his family. "The job they did in emergency of resuscitating me and coordinating the tests and procedures to figure out what happened – that's what kept me alive. I am definitely glad they brought me to the University of Alberta Hospital."

Coming to the rescue

With a \$2.5 million plan in place, donors to the University Hospital Foundation are playing a vital role in redeveloping emergency care at the University of Alberta Hospital

As the only Level One Trauma Centre in northern Alberta, the University of Alberta Hospital's Emergency Department cares for more severely injured patients than anywhere else in Canada.

That's just one of the challenges facing one of the country's busiest Emergency Departments. Another is patient flow, as in, how to get thousands of people the care they need as quickly as possible – in an environment that's outgrown its space.

The University Hospital Foundation, in partnership with Alberta Health Services, has developed a three-step, \$2.5 million plan that will give emergency teams the innovative treatment space and state-of-the-art equipment needed to provide the best care to patients when they need it most.

Donors to the Foundation, and the 2017 Festival of Trees (see story, page 11), have already had significant impact by contributing nearly \$1 million toward expanding and relocating the Rapid Transfer Unit, an integral part of emergency care at the University of Alberta Hospital.

Steps two and three of the Emergency
Department's plan involve creating a waiting area
that's easy to navigate, comfortable and supportive
of every patient's needs; and expanding the Rapid
Assessment Zone, an area for critical assessment,
diagnosis and treatment for patients in Emergency.

"We understand how stressful a visit to the Emergency Department is," said Dr. Bill Sevcik, former Site Chief of the Emergency Department at the University of Alberta Hospital. "Thanks to donor support to the University Hospital Foundation, we're in a position to change that by improving our patient flow and getting you to the care you need as quickly as possible."

Festive fundraising Festival of Trees raises funds for emergency

"Everyone knows someone who's been to Emergency," said Dr. Patricia (Allewell) Nieberding, Chair of the University Hospital Foundation's Festival of Trees. "That's why this cause is so important to us. Emergency is the frontline of healthcare. It impacts everyone."

In 2016, the Emergency Department at the University of Alberta Hospital cared for over 70,000 patients. It was built to accommodate 58,000. As Alberta's population ages, those numbers will only increase, putting even greater strain on equipment and the incredible medical teams who work there.


Taking action, the 2017 Festival of Trees raised nearly \$1 million to improve emergency care by supporting the development of a newer, bigger and more accessible Rapid Transfer Unit. About 25% of the people who go to Emergency are admitted for more specialized care. Since hospital beds are not always readily available, these patients have to wait. Expanding the Rapid Transfer Unit allows them to rest in a quiet, healing environment and begin their specialized treatment until an inpatient bed becomes available.

In addition, by transferring these patients, more space is available in the waiting room. "It's about adding comfort and efficiency for people when they really need it," said Dr. Bill Sevcik, former Site Chief of Emergency at the University of Alberta Hospital. "No one wants to be here longer than they have to be."

"The Festival of Trees is proud to be the largest single fundraising event of the year for the University Hospital Foundation," added Dr. (Allewell) Nieberding. "Every year, our 2000 volunteers do everything they can to make Christmas special for visitors of all ages and to advance care for patients who often need every bit of help they can get to survive."

Previous causes supported by the Festival of Trees include bringing Canada's first Stroke Ambulance to Edmonton; adding Gamma Knife, the most advanced form of noninvasive brain surgery, to the Brain Centre at the University of Alberta Hospital; expanding the Cardiovascular Intensive Care Unit at the Mazankowski Alberta Heart Institute; and giving trauma and complex surgery teams the specialized equipment and technology they need to save more lives.





Colleen Foster, 74, isn't quite ready to return to playing tennis yet, but she hopes to before long. Diagnosed with a leaky aorta, Colleen's life was saved by emergency surgery, followed by a lengthy recovery, at the Mazankowski Alberta Heart Institute.

From surviving to flourishing

The signs were there for Colleen Foster; she just didn't see them. She knew she was suddenly more tired than usual and had developed a strange cough – she just didn't think it was anything serious. After all, longevity runs in her family. One aunt, who just turned 102, walks ten blocks to help teach children how to read. She has another aunt who's 99. "I'm only 74," said Colleen. "I'm a baby."

Then she woke up one morning and both her legs were numb. "When I touched my left leg it felt cold and stiff, like a dead person." If not for the cardiac surgical teams at the Mazankowski Alberta Heart Institute, she may have been one.

When they were young, all three of Colleen's children were downhill ski racers. "We spent a lot of our time skiing and training in the mountains. And when they were skiing, I was skiing," said Colleen. She also played tennis regularly with her "tennis pals" and loved to travel. "I've always been really, really healthy."

Every corner of care in the Maz
- from diagnosis
to treatment to rehabilitation – as well as ground breaking research initiatives, has been support.

Her lifestyle began to change in the summer of 2017. A lifelong night owl, Colleen suddenly preferred staying home and going to bed early. On a trip to Rome to visit her daughter, she was less energetic than usual. And her tennis pals noticed that each time she served, she would have to take an extra deep breath or two. Also, she developed a cough that concerned her enough to see her doctor.

"He didn't like it either," said Colleen. "He sent me for tests and referred me to the Maz." On January 10 – her birthday – she was too tired to celebrate. The next day, she awoke and her left leg was numb. It lasted about ten minutes. Long enough to convince her that something was seriously wrong.

By 6:00 that evening, Colleen was having life-saving surgery to repair a leak in her aorta, the largest blood vessel in the human body. "I had blood in places it wasn't supposed to be and very little where it had to be. I was told that if I hadn't gone for surgery that day, I wouldn't have survived. And even with the surgery, my chances were no better than 50/50," said Colleen.

Donors to the University Hospital Foundation have contributed over \$80 million to the Mazankowski Alberta Heart Institute, including one of every four dollars it took to build one of North America's leading heart institutes. Every corner of care in the Maz has been impacted by donor support: diagnosis, treatment, rehabilitation and ground-breaking research.

Five weeks after surgery, Colleen was well enough to begin a rehabilitation program at The Jim Pattison Centre for Heart Health at the Maz. And now, thanks to the outreach program offered through the Pattison Centre, Colleen can meet an exercise specialist from the Maz much closer to her home, at the Terwillegar Rec Centre. "Rehabilitation has played a huge role in getting me back on my feet again," said Colleen. "I feel better than I have in months."

Building on excellence

"The stories speak for themselves," said Dr. Robert Welsh, Zone Clinical Department Head, Cardiac Sciences, and cardiologist at the Mazankowski Alberta Heart Institute.

"We have patients who are so sick when they arrive they can't walk five steps. Two weeks later they're back in their communities, living their lives as they did before. Or in some cases, even better than they were before, depending on the nature of their condition."

How does this happen? "Because of donor support to the University Hospital Foundation, we have this amazing building. We have advanced equipment and technology. And we've recruited great doctors to Edmonton, who are able to pursue their ground-breaking research projects and do amazing things for cardiac patients across western Canada," said Dr. Welsh. "That's how you build the level of excellence you see here today."

Doctors like cardiac surgeon Dr. Mike Moon, who performs life-saving, minimally invasive surgery on high-risk patients with complex cardiac conditions; Doctors Jeevan and Jayan Nagendran, whose work as highly skilled surgeons – and their respective transformational research projects in the areas of heart valve replacement and lung transplantation – are making waves in cardiac care centres across North America; and Dr. Darren Freed, a cardiac surgeon/researcher whose research in repairing dysfunctional donor hearts may one day eliminate the need for wait lists for patients who need a heart transplant.

"Once you've established a level of excellence, you build on it," added Dr. Welsh. "That's the stage we're at right now at the Maz. Great doctors want to come here to join the amazing team we currently have."

From the beginning of the campaign to build the Maz right up to today, community support has contributed over \$80 million – and counting – in helping to create what is widely regarded as one of North America's leading heart institutes.

"Donor support is intertwined in everything we do here," added Mishaela Houle, Executive Director of the Mazankowski Alberta Heart Institute. "We have one of the best groups of researchers in the country. We have world leading cardiologists, cardiac surgeons, and highly skilled staff. The Maz was built to be the go-to centre for cardiac care in western Canada, and it's truly living up to that – thanks to donor support."



Transformative generosity -

from the heart, to the heart

Drs. Dianne Kipnes and Irv Kipnes. recipients of the **University Hospital** Foundation's 2017 **Peter Lougheed** Award for the **Advancement of** Health Sciences. were also each appointed Members of the **Order of Canada** in 2018 for their leadership and philanthropy.



"It was very important for the University of Alberta Hospital to build on its incredible history in cardiac surgery and become the site of a world-leading cardiac care centre," said Dr. Dianne Kipnes, recalling the days when the Mazankowski Alberta Heart Institute, now one of the leading heart institutes in North America, was little more than an idea on paper.

As they have for the University Hospital Foundation's Brain Centre Campaign and the Campaign for Prostate Health, which led to the creation of the Northern Alberta Urology Clinic at the Kaye Edmonton Clinic, Dianne and Irv gave in more ways than one – through their leadership, dedication and generosity, the Maz has become the center for cardiac care for patients in northern Alberta and across western and northern Canada.


For their lifelong support of the arts and their many generous contributions of time and donations to health-related initiatives, Irv and Dianne were awarded the University Hospital Foundation's 2017 Peter Lougheed Award for the Advancement of Health Sciences.

"The generosity of Irv and Dianne Kipnes has changed and saved the lives of thousands of western Canadians and has enriched the lives of millions more," said Robert Bessette, Past Chair of the University Hospital Foundation's Board of Trustees. "As a couple, they have mentored a new generation of business leaders in philanthropy."

"What we're really trying to do is improve the health of the whole community," said Dianne. "That means improving care for the entire body. Whether it's the heart or the brain, it's all interconnected."







Edmonton businessman Salim Chatoor suffered a stroke very similar to the stroke that took his mother's life many years before. Thanks to advances in stroke care at the University of Alberta Hospital – funded by donors to the University Hospital Foundation – Salim is very much back in business today.

Making miracles happen

What stands out most vividly for Salim Chatoor is how little he knew about strokes when he found his mother on the floor in the bathroom. "We tried to lift her to her feet but she couldn't stand," he said. "She couldn't talk. She couldn't move. All she could do was stare in silence. We had no idea what to do."

Fourteen years later, it was Salim who collapsed. Paralyzed by a stroke of his own, Salim was rushed to the University of Alberta Hospital, where the race to save his life began.

Salim and his young family were living in Vancouver when his mother had her stroke. It was 2003, and she was visiting from Pakistan. Rushed by ambulance to the nearest hospital, they were told when they arrived that she would have to wait to see a doctor. Three hours later, her stroke was officially diagnosed. However, since the treatment window for clot-busting medication had closed, there was nothing doctors could do.

Fast forward to 2017, Salim was preparing to go out for the evening when suddenly he fell to the floor. "I felt nothing and could do nothing. Very similar to my mother."

With one very notable exception. Thanks to donor support to the University Hospital Foundation's Brain Centre Campaign, the University of Alberta Hospital – equipped with the most advanced and innovative technology and equipment in the world – has become the centre for stroke care for patients in northern Alberta and across western Canada.

Fortunately for Salim, he was taken to the University of Alberta Hospital. Within 90 minutes of his stroke, he received the clot-busting drug tPA, the goto treatment for strokes caused by blocked blood flow to the brain. When tPA failed to work as efficiently as predicted, stroke doctors quickly determined that Salim needed a highly specialized clot retrieval procedure known as an endovascular thrombectomy. Thanks to donor support, the hospital has two fully equipped neurovascular interventional suites where the procedure is performed.

As the medical team prepared Salim for this procedure that could save his life, he took note of the fact that he could understand everything they were saying – but had no ability to communicate back to them. Also, the entire right side of his body was

paralyzed. Then suddenly, as the tPA medication burst through the clot, he moved his right hand. As doctors looked on in amazement, Salim moved his right arm, then his right leg, and then began to talk.

"I said to them, 'Am I dreaming or am I awake?' They assured me this was really happening, even though I could see they were having a hard time believing it themselves."

In April, barely five months after his stroke, Salim went on a business trip to China. The vigorous travel schedule took him to Beijing, Hong Kong, and many other stops along the way. When he returned he was perfectly fine.

Race against time

Donor-driven research to cut stroke diagnosis from hours to minutes

Dr. Glen Jickling, a stroke neurologist and researcher at the University of Alberta Hospital, is moving closer to developing a blood test that will reduce precious time-to-treatment by enabling doctors to identify a stroke in a matter of minutes. "Rapidly identifying a patient having a stroke is essential to getting them the urgent treatment they need," said Dr. Jickling.

For donors to the University Hospital Foundation's Brain Centre Campaign, funding Dr. Jickling's research is yet another way they have advanced stroke care at the University of Alberta Hospital. From putting Canada's first Stroke Ambulance on the road to opening a second specialized operating suite for life-saving clot removal procedures, community support has transformed care for stroke patients. But there's still the challenging issue of diagnosing a stroke quickly and accurately — under the intense pressure that comes when someone's life is on the line.

Funding research is yet another way donors have advanced stroke care.

Misdiagnosing a stroke and administering the wrong treatment can be deadly. At the same time, a stroke left untreated may leave a loved one unable to walk, talk, remember your name, or, in the worst possible situation, your loved one may die.

The critical issue is time. Two million brain cells die every minute when blood can't get to your brain. The faster a patient is diagnosed and, if required, administered clot-busting tPA medication, the better their chances of survival and full recovery. "The blood test will tell doctors within minutes whether a stroke has occurred or not," said Dr. Jickling. "Then they can make definitive decisions about next steps."

Critical to the success of Dr. Jickling's research is the Stroke Ambulance. "We needed a way to draw blood from patients as soon as possible after their stroke," he explains. "With the highly specialized stroke team and lab on board, the Stroke Ambulance gives us that access. We'll also be able to take blood samples at regular intervals from the patient, which is really what we need to develop this test."

"By supporting Dr. Glen Jickling and his research, donors to the University Hospital Foundation are guiding the future of stroke care as much as they're impacting stroke care today," said Guy Scott, Foundation's Board of Trustees, and Co-chair of the Brain Centre Campaign.

Doreen succumbed to a stroke on May 15, 2017. Her friends and family lost a loved one. "There was nothing

anyone could do," said Lorne. In recognition of his transformational gift, the rehabilitation clinic at the Kaye Edmonton Clinic has been re-named the Doreen Lutsky Hooper Rehabilitation Clinic.

Providing critically important rehabilitation services to more than 2,300 patients every year, the clinic plays a pivotal role in stroke and brain injury recovery, and in helping patients adapt to brain conditions such as multiple sclerosis and Parkinson's.

"Thanks to Lorne's generosity, and Doreen's incredibly giving spirit, her legacy will have a tremendous impact on brain patients for many, many years," said Jim Brown, Chair of the University Hospital Foundation's Board of Trustees.



Of the \$24.3 million distributed in 2017-2018, \$18.4 million was invested in critical areas of patient care and \$5.9 million in medical research. The Foundation has also made commitments to distribute an additional \$16 million over the next three years, bringing our committed distributions from 2008-2021 to \$144 million.

Diversified Revenue Sources




Invest in Impact Through Donor Created Established Funds

In addition to tremendous community support, growth in our Established Funds has enhanced our ability to impact patient care. Over the past year we added seven new Established Funds, bringing our total to 217 funds with a total value of \$89 million.

Of the \$24.3 million that was distributed in 2017-2018, \$4 million came from our Established Funds. Fund balances that are not distributed are invested within our balanced investment portfolio strategy.

The Foundation prides itself on being a secure place for donors to invest in long-term impact through the commitment that any unrealized market value losses are not allocated to the Established Funds. Instead, such losses are absorbed by the Foundation's General Fund.

The Role of Investments

The growth of our investments allows the Foundation to provide sustained support to the University of Alberta Hospital site. During the 2017-2018 fiscal year, our investment returns remained strong — providing a total return of 5.24%.

Each year 80% of the five year average rate of return is allocated to our Established Funds. In 2017-18, investment income was allocated at a rate of 7.73% (\$6.5 million).





Growth in Net Assets Versus Established Funds




Cost to Raise a Dollar Versus Benchmark
